


Function of the Needs Statement






Function of the Needs Statement

What you propose to do to address the problem



Importance of Needs Statements

In short,
you
answer
the
question:

"Why care?"

- Demonstrates that there is a problem that:
 - Is important
 - Is significant
 - Is urgent
- ► Builds trust
- Relates to your mission statement
- Relates to the funder's priorities





- Establishes the problem.
- > Describes conditions outside your agency.
- Leads to the helpful actions you propose.
- ► Is your first impression.




Contents: Problem Description

- Problem description The 5 W's
 - □ Who?
 - What?
 - Where?
 - □ Why?
 - When?

Contents: Recognition

- Problem recognition
 - Who else sees it?
 - Community stakeholders views
 - High profile views
 - Data on the problems raw data (e.g., Census) or data that has been analyzed (e.g., Center for Education Policy Research [CEPR] reports)



Contents: Implications

- Problem implications
 - What are resulting problems?
 - □ If not resolved?
 - What happens to community?
 - What happens to target audience?
 - □ Cost to society?



Contents: Hurdles

- Problem hurdles
 - Gap
 - Knowledge gaps
 - Current Work
 - What has prevented resolution/improvement
 - Logjams and speed bumps



Contents: Urgency

- Problem urgency
 - □ Why now?





Contents for needs statements

- Human interest story
 - Similar client
 - Similar circumstances
 - Positive resolution
 - Demonstrates your interventions





- ► Orient: Covers the Five W's
- Engage: Problem urgency and importance
- Narrow Solution: Challenges and gaps

Need Statement Tips

- Address the 5 W's
- "Weighty Words"
- Get 'em in the heart, get 'em in the head
- ► The 4 C's
- ► Thoughtful wording of statistics
- Use formatting skillfully
- Check scoring, rating criteria





The bottom line is that to have a fundable project, it must potentially solve the problem your organization and the grantmaker are interested in and must generate results that can be measured in some way.
